# **President's Message**

A month ago, I had high hopes that we would be able to meet again in July. However, after hearing about the increase in COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, along with the County's decision to pause reopening, the CQG Board made the decision to cancel July's Guild meeting as well. We will continue to have Zoom Coffee Break meetings every two weeks until we are able to meet again in person. I encourage you to



take advantage of this wonderful opportunity to stay connected to your friends in the Guild. We are keeping our fingers crossed for August. The Challenge will once again be postponed or possibly reconfigured.

Election results are in and we now have our 2020-21 Guild board and new bylaws moving forward. The new Board officially takes over (only 4 position changes) on July 1st and likewise, the Bylaws go into effect on that same date. Just after the ballots were mailed, Mary Maxwell volunteered to be our new Recording Secretary. She was appointed by the Board at the June 18 meeting. The new Board and Committee Members (still missing a few) are listed in this newsletter and are posted on our website.

We had a tremendous return of ballots - 169 (out of 204). Even though this was not a contested election, it was still wonderful to have so many responses. In order to change the Bylaws, a vote from 1/3 of our members was required and we nearly doubled that. Thanks to all who sent in their ballots.

The mask-making project is continuing, even though the urgency seems to have subsided a bit. We have now made 4,730 masks and the count is continuing to grow. We are currently working on children's masks after Governor Newsom's report that children will have to wear masks when school begins in the fall. Please check our website for updates. 



# Block of the Month for August 2020 Ruins of Jericho Block

12 x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" Unfinished)





Because this block is called Ruins of Jericho, please make the 'red' any color and use any interesting fabric from your stash.

## **Cutting**

• White Solid or White on White:

Cut 4 - 2" x 3 1/2" Rectangles

Cut 4 - 2" x 6 1/2" Rectangles

Cut 4 - 3 7/8" Squares

• Any Color From Your Stash:

Cut 8 - 2" Squares

Cut 4 - 3 7/8" Squares


## **Assembly**

Use 1/4" seam allowances.


**1.** To make the 8 Half-Square Triangles (HST) place (4) White 3 7/8" squares on top of (4) Red 3 7/8" squares. Draw a line diagonally across the square, mark ¼" seam line on either side of line. Stitch on the marked seamlines. Cut down the center line and press seam away from White.




**2.** Sew (2) Red 2" squares and (1) 2" x 3 1/2" rectangle together, sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" rectangle on top the Unit. Make (4) of these Units.



**3.** To make the central Unit, sew the (4) HST together.



**4.** Sew two units to the sides of the center unit as shown, then sew 4 HSTs to the Red/White units as shown to form top and bottom rows. Sew 3 rows together to create the block.
