


August Program: Annual Picnic-Potluck "Silver & Gold...Make New Friends & Keep the Old"

September Workshop: Julia McLeod - "Starting with Silk"

Friday, September 15, 9 am - 3 pm, St. Andrew's Church, 4575 Auhay St., Santa Barbara, In-person

We are so fortunate to have Julia McLeod coming from the Bay Area to present her workshop in person! "Starting with Silk" promises to give us new ways to reclaim beautiful fabrics that may have been stuck in a closet or drawers.

Julia likes to promote fabric reclamation, rescuing fabrics such as silk from neckties, kimonos, and

other "not cotton" fabrics, then turning them into beautiful creations that will be out and enjoyed instead of hidden away. If you were at the July Guild meeting you heard Sam McIlraith talk about Julia and her work. Sam had the



pleasure of taking a class with Julia previously and thinks very highly of her.

Julia has several new techniques to teach us, as well as helpful knowledge about using fusible stabilizers when working with silk. The workshop will give us a chance to do some exercises, both improvisational and using foundation piecing, and then working on a pillow sized piece. Julia is an experienced quilt artist and teacher, and gets fantastic reviews. She has a number of teaching videos and examples of her work on her website at JuliaMcLeodquilts.com. She is also on Facebook and Instagram with more great photos, just search for Julia McLeod Quilts.

Quilting Tips, Tools and Hacks #1

Have you ever taken a workshop and found that a single simple tip vastly improves your quilting process or product? Cybersecurity For Quilt Guilds

The SCCQG July presentation was on "Cybersecurity for Quilt Guilds" by Dr. Linda F. Wilson, Department Chairperson for Math, Computer Science, & Information Systems at Texas Lutheran University. Her advice:

- Automated tools are used by hackers to extract your information. Once they have your information, it's too late to get it back. Make it difficult enough for them to give up and go to another target. It's about building obstacles. Hackers are always present.
- Password Security: Don't be lazy about your password creations. Short and easy passwords are hackable, e.g. 1-2-3-4. Don't use the same password for multiple sites. Don't share, not even with your relatives. Don't write on post-it notes; then stick them on your computer for people to see. Don't use dictionary words, dog's or children's names, etc.
- Creating Password: Take a phrase, then alter it.
 For example, "QuiltsforEverMore" can be altered to "Q1tz4evrM0r!!" Make them long & complicated, using capital letters, numbers, & symbols.
- Sign up for 2-step authentication.

Other advice:

- Don't assume there's any privacy online. Search engines find everything! Use strong passwords for social media.
- Facebook Groups: Public not advised. Private groups are only as safe as the members that have very good passwords. A member's compromised password causes a security breach to an entire Facebook group.
- Web Site Security: Only 2 administrators. Needs strong & complicated password, changed periodically.
- Sharing Documents: Better to use Google Docs and share the link.
- Financial Documents: Best sent on a secured site.

Block of the Month for September 2023 Fall Scraps

15" x 15" Block (15.5" x 15.5" unfinished)



Cutting

- Cut a piece of light orange 1 ½" by the width of the fabric.
- Cut a piece of dark orange 1 ½" by width of fabric.
- Cut 6 green squares 3 ¼" and 6 Kona egg shell 3 ¾" squares .
- Cut 5 3½" squares.

Assembly

- Use the strips to make 8 1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles of dark orange and 4 1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles of light orange.
- Use the rest of the strips to make nine patches of 1 ½" squares.
- Make 12 half square triangles out of the green and egg shell squares. Put right sides together and draw a diagonal line across the egg shell and sew scant ¼" on each side of the line. Cut on the line and press to dark.
- Sew this together in rows.

Library News


Hello quilters! Summer is passing too swiftly but I hope you're all finding time to do things that you love.
