I was heartened to hear Patti say at a recent meeting that the quilt can have some three-dimensional aspects. And just yesterday I tuned in to the Coffee Break where Polly shared tips and the best supplies to work with fused and machine stitched appliqué. I have landed on a concept that I think will work and I will rely heavily on the story behind the design. I guess this is why the project is called "A Challenge." I hope you will accept this quilting challenge too.

On another note, I was one of the twenty or so Guild members who met to cut, sort and price fabrics for our upcoming sale. There is so much great fabric, ready to be sold at bargain prices on April 20 at St. Andrew's Church. Thank you, Linda Bird, for sharing your garage, laundry and sewing rooms (and supplies), as we spread out to do our work. And thank you, Ranell, for imagining ways to make this sale run smoothly and even more effectively than the last one. Interestingly, Elisa Purnell told me that the complete Newsletter team was present and finally able to meet one another in person, even though they have been working together for the last three years!

I was recently given a pair of socks that say, "if it's



fabric, it's not hoarding." I look forward to seeing you at the sale, as a worker, a shopper or both. We will be expanding our "collections" which, since fabric is involved, is not hoarding.

"Survival- Native American Quilts 1880-2022" by Teresa Duryea Wong, May 9, 7 pm, virtual program via Zoom, Live Oak Unitarian Universalist Congregation. 2024 Challenge please complete the Entry Form, now located on the Guild website. Entries are due at the beginning of the Guild meeting on May 9. Viewing and voting will occur at June's live meeting. The requirements for the Challenge can be found on the Guild's website.



To enter:

- Complete the Challenge Entry Form, available on the Guild website (<u>here</u>) or by contacting Patti Hunter at <u>prwhunter@cox.net</u>.
- Attach a 2-4" hanging sleeve to the back of your entry, unless it is a 3D piece.
- Attach a <u>covered</u> label to the back or bottom of your entry.
- Submit your entry in a pillowcase securely labeled with your name, phone number and email, along with the completed entry form. If your entry will not fit in a pillowcase or needs special handling, be sure it is completely covered and securely labeled before submitting it.

If you absolutely, positively can't get your entry to the Guild meeting on May 9, please arrange with Patti Hunter, Ranell Hansen or Carol Fay for its delivery. Since all entries must be viewed at the June meeting and none will be judged by photograph, if you do not intend to come to the May meeting you can ship your entry to Carol Fay,1417 Camino Rio Verde, Santa Barbara, CA 93111.

Community Projects

At the March meeting, six beautiful veteran quilts were displayed and then delivered to Lucia Herrara from the Visiting Nurses Association (VNA). During her presentation, she shared with us a sample photograph and the pins given during the pinning ceremony that accompanies each quilt donated to a veteran. She indicated that each recipient and family members were very appreciative of these wonderful quilts and they often became treasured mementos. After her very grateful speech, she informed us that there were Bundtlets for us on the patio as a thank you.

Recently four fidget quilts were delivered to Vista Del Monte and ten fidget quilts to Maravilla. As a result, our stash of both fidget quilts and Veteran quilts is now depleted. We have fabric for both kinds of quilts plus "knick knacks" for the fidget quilts and will bring these supplies to the next meeting.

Unity Shoppe has told us they will need 108 cradle quilt kits for the Christmas holiday giveaway. As of now, we have approximately 65 quilt kits finished, with a big thanks to Marian Jones who took 20 kits. We will bring more unfinished kits to the next meeting, so please take one or two and help us meet Unity Shoppe's goal.

Also stored at the Guild's locker are a variety of quilt tops that need finishing. Susan White has volunteered to meet with those who would like to finish a quilt top. There will be backing and batting available. Please let Susan know if you are interested and she can meet with you.

So in summary, sewists are needed for fidget quilts, Veteran quilts, cradle quilts and finishing a variety of quilt tops. Supplies are available for completing all these projects. Please stop by our table or contact Susan White if interested. Many thanks for your support.

This new notion is the Bee's Knees! Yup, it's hitting me at long last - arthritis in the hands. Picking up a pair of small scissors and cutting several threads can really cause pain at times. Do you know what I mean? I discovered the <u>Bladesaver Thread Cutter</u> tool. It does not come with a razor blade, as some other products do, but you use one of your used rotary cutter blades in the thread cutter. Goodness knows we have those! Recycling is good!

I recently was working on a project, doing long lines of chain piecing. I was able to cut the threads between the pieces in a jiffy and had no pain in my hands. The Bladesaver comes in a variety of colors and is available through many sources, but the link above will take you to the Amazon listing. I just love this little gadget and yes, I think it's the Bee's Knees or maybe even the Cat's Pajamas!

Coffee Break Updates



Block of the Month - May 2024 May Flowers

12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Cutting & Assembly

- Cut 4– 4 ½" squares of flower petals.
- Cut 1–4 ½" square for the flower center.
- Cut 2– 5" squares of green.
- Cut 2- 5" squares of a second flower petals.
- Make 4 half square triangles using the 5" squares.
- Sew these together in rows.
