President's Message

My non quilting friends cannot understand why I

leave my well-equipped sewing room, pack up my 15-pound travel machine, and drive to sew with other Guild members. They, and we, know that quilting is largely a solitary craft and designing a quilt, along with production



cutting and piecing, is effectively done at home. They, and we, also know that the Internet will provide video tutorials and pattern resources and that Amazon will deliver just about anything the next day. Why do we join Satellite Groups? We start going for the ideas and we keep going for the advice and friendship. I am always inspired by what my creative friends are sewing, knitting, crafting, reading and learning while they are volunteering and traveling.

Full disclosure: I am in 3 Satellite Groups. The first is golden, with friendships that have deepened through sharing and loss over the last decade. Another meets monthly for a four hour stretch of time which is perfect for making real progress on a quilt. And the last has the benefit of an experienced quilt instructor who, even after years, is still finding new products and techniques to share. We show our projects (and they are amazing) and help one another over quilting design blocks. How should I get this wrinkle out? What color thread should I use to quilt this top? I'm not going to risk ruining my finished top, so where should I send it to get it quilted? Our friends provide ideas and solutions.

I have not mentioned the quilt show, because by now the plan is set and we will act on the plan. As you view what our members choose to exhibit, you will get to know them through their quilts. At our most recent Guild meeting we provided African-themed fabrics to be used by members who attended Kenya Dorsey's workshop.




